## USE

# **PATTERN**



Your ceiling is probably smooth and white, but lots of buildings have patterned ones that catch the light, or tell stories to people who visit them.

## WHAT TO DO

Lie on the floor in your room and think about how colour and pattern would look on your ceiling.

Use colourful, textured or reflective materials (like kitchen foil) to add to your ceiling outline on the first page.

## **TOP TIP**

You could use string or even spaghetti to create texture and then paint over it when it's dry.

## SOME THINGS YOU COULD USE

Pens, Pencils, Paint, Card, Cotton Wool, Scissors, String, Spaghetti, Kitchen Foil, Coloured Paper, Ruler, Bottle Tops, Stickers...

Some ceilings are painted to look like the sky, or have holes in them so you can see the sky for real!

### WHAT TO DO

Go outside and lie on the ground under the sky, or under a tree, and add what you see to the ceiling you drew on the first page.



### **TOP TIP**

You could lay a mirror on the ground and draw what you see so that your neck doesn't get sore!
