3.

Write 5 interesting questions (or more) to ask the very boring thing. Answer your questions on behalf of the thing, in the voice you think would be the right one.

4.

Pretend you're an expert and write how/why this boring thing was made. Invent wild facts for fun.

Write as if you know more than anyone else about it.

5.

Draw a comic strip of your boring thing doing something incredible.

Make it so amazing that you can hardly believe it yourself.

Shock yourself!



Write the most boring poem you can about this boring thing.

10 lines please. (It doesn't have to rhyme.)

7.

Write the word 'Boring' large, in an interesting way.

Maybe it's on fire or it's crying peanut butter.

Maybe it's made out of honeycomb buildings on another world.





8.

Draw a comic strip of the boring thing you picked shooting into the sky and exploding as a firework.

9.

Draw a picture of an alien finding your boring thing.

Write what the alien thinks this thing is.

Does it think it's something amazing, magical?

Or is the alien bored too?



10.

Draw pictures of yourself slowly turning into this item. Is it still so boring?

When you've finished, wink at your boring thing. Maybe give it a weird high five too.

Now you can do it all again, but with the most interesting thing you can find.

Think of your own exercises to do too, for example:

- Make a crown for the boring thing.
- Make a paper twin of the boring thing.
- Do boring things really exist????? (I think they do! haha!)
